Tips for Healthy Communication

One of the toughest things for people is communication. We can easily talk, write or type something. What most of us are not good at is communicating our thoughts, feelings and even our ideas to others (or better yet...to the right others) especially when we disagree with someone.

Jesus tells us in Matthew 18:15-17.

¹⁵If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one. ¹⁶But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses. ¹⁷If the member refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector.


Here are some tips for effective communication when there is conflict or disagreement:

- Pray!
- Calm down and avoid speaking in anger
- You may want to seek guidance from a trusted spouse/friend before talking to the person but make sure you are seeking honest advice and feedback instead of gossip. Make sure that person does not gossip to others about your conversation.
- Give grace to others. Avoid judgment.
- Pray!
- Speak directly to the person instead of complaining or gossiping to others.
- Speak in private.
- If you're afraid to talk to the person, write down your thoughts but it's best to talk directly to the person.
- · Pray!

Although we do not like to be criticized, we would

rather hear it from the horse's mouth than from a third party. Why? It allows clarity and explanation of the situation which can lead to a direct chance at apology/reconciliation.

Effective communication is something everyone



needs to work on including me, and Jesus' method of communicating works in all our relationships (spouse, family, business, coworkers, neighbors and community).

It evens works in church communities! If you ever have an issue with Hosanna's leadership, please follow Jesus' advice and contact that person directly rather than gossiping or complaining. If someone expresses frustration to you, advise them to talk to the person directly. This will allow Jesus' light to shine brightly through Hosanna and into the community.

Because many of us have been in hibernation since March of 2020, you may be wondering if DO SOMETHING has been hibernating also. The answer is a definite NO! We have continued helping people in our church as well as people in the community when we have been aware of a need. DO SOMETHING is actually behind the COVID CARES outreach that has been going on since last summer. Below is a list of things DO SOMETHING has done in the past year:

- Helping Hands for member (11-13 to 11-18) 3
 volunteers
- Helping Hands for member (11-19 to 12-3) 5 volunteers
- Thanksgiving Dinner for shut in member (11-26) \$55
- Flowers for member (12-13) \$53.61
- Donation for a member's medical expenses (2-5-2021) \$500.00
- Depends products for LEADS (2-18-2021) \$296.25

**We have had 17 people working on 5 teams since the beginning of October 2020. Three volunteers contacted people who had been regulars before COVID to see if they wanted communion and a visit. We have had 22 households being visited and given communion on a one, two, or four week schedule depending on their wishes. When COVID did the uptake and cold weather set in, we switched to phone contacts and dropping off communion so they could take it as they watched the service online.

As you can see, many volunteers have been involved in helping this past year! There is no way, the DO SOMETHING committee could do it all! This list is by no means complete because many of you have volunteered to help others on your own and there is no way to track all those acts of kindness! Thank you, Hosanna for your generosity in supporting this important ministry with your time, talents, and finances!


